**PROCLAMATION**

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS COME – GREETINGS:

WHEREAS: Toxic injury is a chronic, debilitating condition with no known cure, which people of every age, race, and background can contract from having short-term or chronic exposure to one or more chemicals frequently found in pesticides, solvents, and other common substances; and

WHEREAS: This condition is often characterized by medical intolerance or heightened sensitivity to very small amounts of air pollution, petrochemicals, and other toxins found in the products we use every day in our homes and workplaces; and

WHEREAS: Symptoms of toxic injury include, but are not limited to, headaches, poor concentration, memory loss, stroke-like symptoms, seizures, heart palpitations, aching joints, burning sensations, breathing difficulty, and skin irritations; and

WHEREAS: Toxic Injury can be life-threatening and can also cause serious financial, employment, learning, housing, health, social hardships; and

WHEREAS: The prevalence of toxic injury and the lack of knowledge about this disorder warrant further exploration to better understand the illness and to find a cure for those who have been stricken with it; and

WHEREAS: The State of Arkansas places a high priority on the health and well-being of its citizens and joins in the efforts to raise awareness about toxic injury by urging citizens to make safer product choices and implement safer practices when handling dangerous chemicals;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MIKE BEEBE, Governor of the State of Arkansas, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the laws of the State of Arkansas, do hereby proclaim May 2009, as

**TOXIC INJURY AWARENESS AND EDUCATION MONTH**

across the State of Arkansas, and urge all citizens to increase awareness, education, understanding, and research into the causes, diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of toxic injury.
