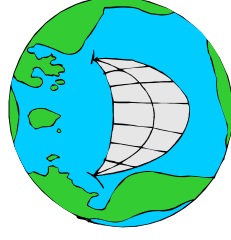

## Furniture Polish

### Olive Oil

- Put a few drops of on a polishing cloth and rub on furniture.

### Safflower Oil

- Put a few drops of on a polishing cloth and rub on furniture.

## Air Freshener

### White Distilled Vinegar

- Place in spray bottle and spray in the air as needed to eliminate odors.

### Baking Soda

- Place ¼ cup of baking soda in a spray bottle of warm water.
- Shake and spray in the air as needed.

## Carpet Shampoo

### Borax, Alcohol, Boric Acid, & Vinegar (Clark, 1995)

- Wash water: 1/3 cup borax
- Rinse water:  
1/4 cup grain alcohol  
2 tsp. boric acid  
1/4 cup white distilled vinegar OR 4 tsp. citric acid

## Carpet Deodorizer

### Baking Soda

- Sprinkle and vacuum like any carpet powder

## Mirror and Glass Cleaner

### Peroxide

- Fill a spray bottle with peroxide to clean glass and mirrors.

### White Distilled Vinegar

- Mix 50% vinegar and 50% water in a spray bottle and clean as usual.

### Club Soda

- Fill a spray bottle to clean glass and mirrors.



## Tub and Tile Cleaner

### 3% Hydrogen Peroxide & White Vinegar

- Use 50% peroxide solution in a spray bottle to disinfect.
- For added disinfecting follow with a 100% spray solution of white distilled vinegar.

### Borax or Baking Soda

Put 2 teaspoons of borax in a 16 oz spray bottle filled with hot water. Shake to blend. Spray and wipe as needed.

### Washing Soda & Baking Soda

Mix 1/3 cup washing soda with 1 cup baking soda and use it as you would any scour powder.

## Toilet Cleaner

### 3% Hydrogen Peroxide

- Clean your toilet with peroxide to kill germs and leave a fresh smell. Simply put a little on your cleaning cloth when you wipe, or spray it on the toilet.
- Pour ½ cup inside toilet and use brush as usual.

### Borax or Baking Soda

- Put 1 cup in the toilet water and let sit. Scrub out with brush.



## Floor Cleaner

### Washing Soda & Vinegar

- Use washing soda from the grocery store to mop floors.
- Use white distilled vinegar in your rinse water for a clean shine.
