A Proclamation

**TOXIC INJURY AWARENESS AND
EDUCATION MONTH
MAY 2010**

WHEREAS, People throughout the world have developed illnesses from Toxic Injury also known as Chemically Induced Illness; and

WHEREAS, Toxic Injury is often characterized by medical intolerance to very small amounts of air pollution, petrochemicals, mold and other toxins found in buildings and everyday products; and

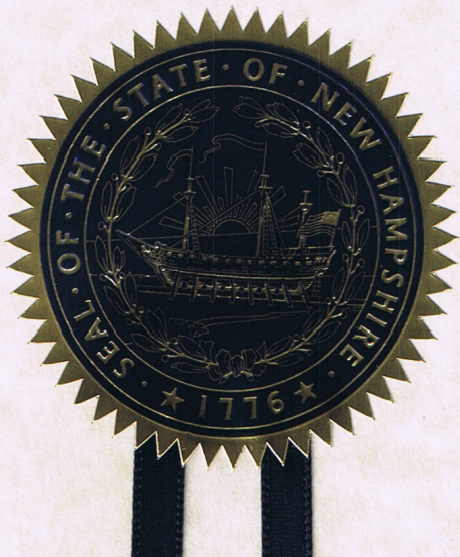
WHEREAS, The prevalence of these illnesses, the lack of widespread knowledge, and the shortage of qualified doctors warrant further education in this field for the public, medical practitioners, emergency response personnel, and anyone involved in construction or building maintenance; and

WHEREAS, Toxic Injury may include multiple, often disabling illnesses, affecting the respiratory, central nervous, immune, musculoskeletal, and other viral systems, and can be life threatening; and


WHEREAS, Toxic Injury is a chronic debilitating condition causing serious financial, employment, housing, health, and other consequences; and

WHEREAS, It is important for those with Toxic Injury to have support and understanding as they struggle with the restrictions and isolation imposed by the illness;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOHN H. LYNCH, GOVERNOR of the State of New Hampshire, do hereby proclaim **MAY 2010** as **TOXIC INJURY AWARENESS MONTH** in New Hampshire and urge citizens to support increased awareness, education, understanding, and research into the causes, diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of Toxic Injury.
